

## Community Information and Output

Community level information on Kids (Kidscount is a national data network established by the Annie E. Casey Foundation. The web site is <http://www.kidscount.org/cgi-bin/links.cgi>

For Michigan, there are currently 16 indicators in 11 categories. The attached table lists them, along with the years of data available and whether or not city data are included.

Data are for individual years unless the Category name specifies that it is a 3 year average.

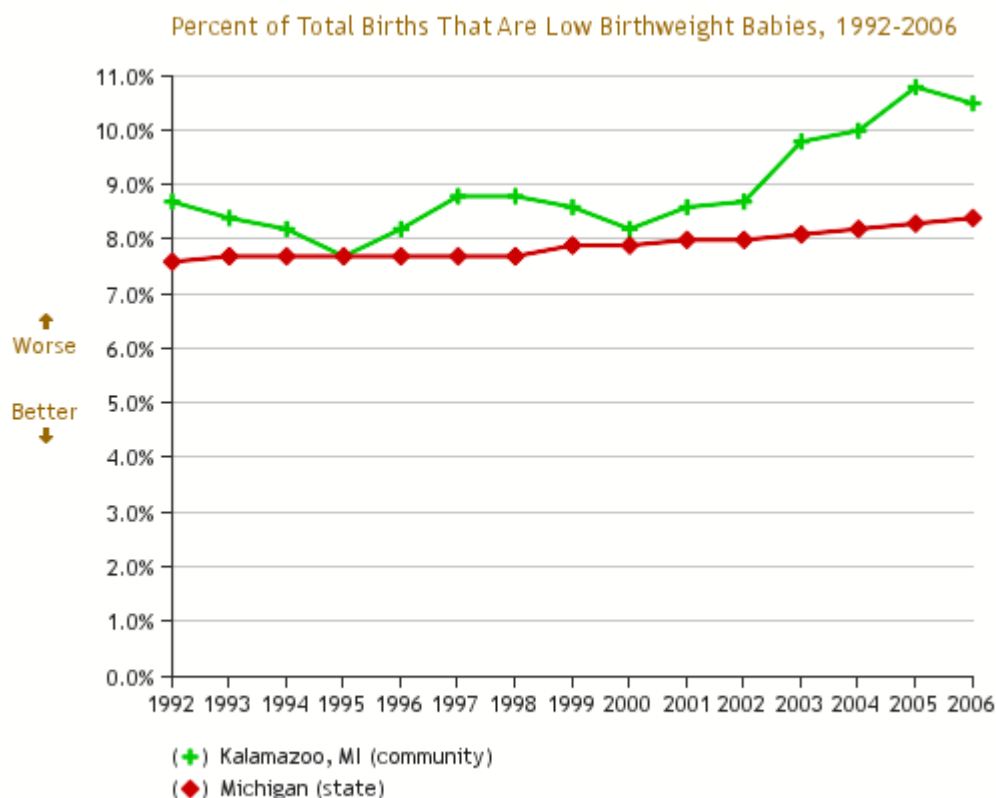

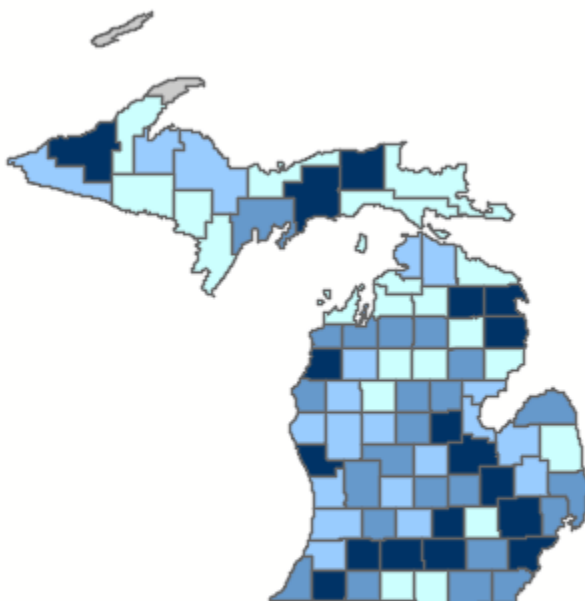

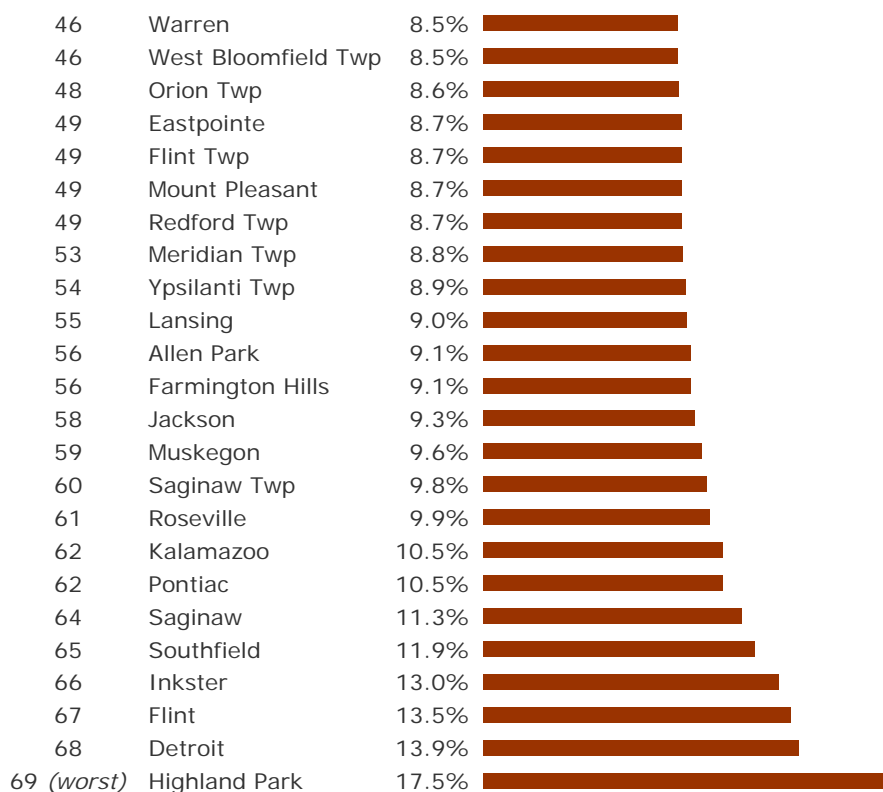
